Testing materials, completing design calculations, and submitting a proposal are all key components of the process. The engineer will evaluate each solution against the criteria and provide constructive feedback.

Year 11 and 12 students passionate about pursuing a career in energy can apply for an exciting, hands-on training opportunity with the **Ergon Energy Network, Energex, and TAFE Queensland pre-apprenticeship program.**

This industry-aligned program offers eligible Year 11 and 12 students the opportunity to complete a Certificate II in Electrotechnology (Career Start) (UEE22020) cadetship and power-up a promising career in Queensland's transformative energy sector.

Cadets will gain real-world experience and training at depots located throughout regional and remote Queensland, facilitated by the Ergon Energy Network and Energex, which are part of Energy Queensland.

Ergon Energy Network and Energex have depots throughout regional and remote Queensland and are part of the Energy Queensland group of electricity distribution, retail and energy services businesses owned by the state of Queensland.

Cadets will learn:

- Essential work, health and safety requirements contextualised to the electrical industry.
- Primary technical skills for the electricity distribution, retail and energy services sector including, the use of multiple power tools and materials, reading and interpreting site plans and specifications.
- Real-world site experience at Ergon Energy Network and Energex depots throughout regional and remote Queensland.
- Enterprise skills by completing Toolbox Talks and providing a formal project handover to the next incoming group at the end of rostered shift.
